In *Invisible Woman*, a dangerous secret held for too long between estranged best friends rises to the surface, and a long marriage comes apart with devastating consequences.



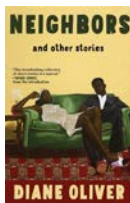

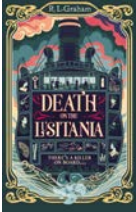

An atmospheric and immersive historical fiction novel set on board the doomed RMS Lusitania ocean liner.



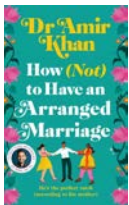

In Brendan Flaherty's debut novel, two estranged brothers must confront the violence of the past when they find out a pond where they played as children will be dredged.



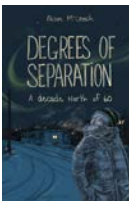
