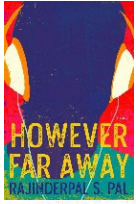

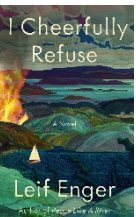

An unforgettable story of friendship, love, and the impact of childhood from the first Arabic-language winner of the Man Booker International Prize.



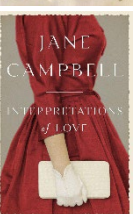

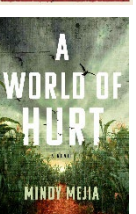

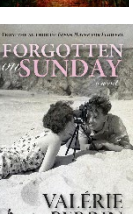
Interpretations of Love by Jane Campbell – Grove/Atlantic – 9780802162885- HC – \$42.95 - Fiction / Literary – Aug 2024

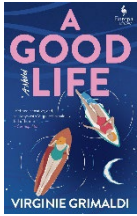

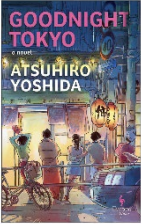

An unforgettable story about an unlikely friendship and about healing the wounds of a broken past from the million-copy bestselling author of *Fresh Water for Flowers*.



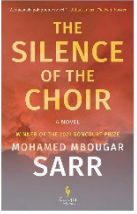

Full of humor and compassion, a profound exploration of sisterhood, healing, and the ineffable beauty of life from France’s most beloved contemporary novelist.



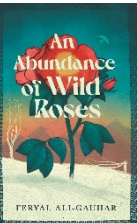

A queer writer travelling through India can't escape the regrets of his past, nor the impending ruin of his present.



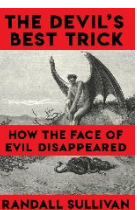
